**26. COMMISSIONING INTENTIONS FOR A CHILDREN
AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S HEALTH AND WELLBEING
SERVICE – EXTENSION OF SERVICE MODEL**

The Director of Children's and Adult Services submitted a report which sought approval to undertake consultation on proposals to extend the proposed new service model for a Children's and Young People's Health and Wellbeing service in Bolton to include a children and young people's substance misuse element in the service.

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The report reminded the Executive Cabinet Member that at her meeting on 30th June, 2014, approval had been given for the commissioning of a new model for the delivery of a Children and young people's Health and Wellbeing Service in Bolton.

In this regard, the report sought approval to consult on proposals to extend the service model to incorporate an integrated and holistic approach to substance misuse.

Enhancement of the proposed service model would provide a unique opportunity to develop preventative programmes, advice, support and targeted interventions to reduce the incidence and impact of substance misuse and ensure that this approach was integral to the new service.

The report outlined the scope of the extended offer and how this would contribute to improved outcomes in key areas of health and wellbeing.

Following a recommendation from the Executive Member for Education and Schools, the Executive Cabinet Member Deputy Leader APPROVED –

Consultation on the inclusion of the 360 Young Person's Substance Misuse and Alcohol Service in the specification for the tender of the 5-19 Children and Young People's Health Service, on the basis detailed in the report now submitted.
