- Based at Breightmet House. Police building. Interview suites on site.





TOTAL OF 81 REFERRALS 2014 TO 2015





TOTAL OF <u>127</u> REFERRALS 2015 TO 2016




Sharp increase in number of referrals to team in last year. More referrals coming through the MASSS. Also increase in numbers of online related grooming and offending

Sharp increase in ages of referrals of younger children. Reflective of children being targeted online and greater recognition of the dangers from parents and professionals

Phoenix Peer Review Dec 2015

- Some victims/offenders not flagged on GMP systems-reviewed all officers in team allocated specific caseload and responsible for flagging and updating
- Need to strengthen links between Phoenix/EXIT and PPIU/INPT/SSOU-not all cases open to SC side open to Officersnew protocols, Monthly governance meeting established with senior officers from above to review all crimes currently being investigated.
- Lack of access to therapeutic services to address the impact of trauma- discussions with commissioners
- Wishes and feelings 'the voice of the child' evident on GMP systemsbriefings communicated to staff
- Number of individual case matters- reviewed and actioned
- All items dealt with as part of ongoing action plan

Current Caseload

- Current open cases- 63
- High Risk CSE- 10
- Medium Risk CSE -36
- Low Risk CSE 6
- Waiting assessment- 8
- N/A -3

Disruption- Weekly Operation

- 2 Uniformed officers patrol hotspot locations, visit offender addresses, conduct bail checks of CSE offenders, monitor ASB incidents (livered vehicle).
- 2 Members of the Exit Team 1 x police officer and 1 EXIT CS worker, work in plain clothes and unmarked vehicle conducting victim visits and monitoring the Hot spot locations.
- New briefing much more focussed on specific time critical objectives based on new and recent intelligence
- Routine offender visits and bail management now carried out by INPT staff as part of daily business
- Hot spot areas eg. parks, fast food outlets, car parks.
