A petition was received relating to the Winifred Kettle Home which was referred to the Director of Children's and Adult services.

#### 62. MINUTES

The minutes of the proceedings of the meeting of the Council held on 4<sup>th</sup> December, 2013 were submitted and signed as a correct record.

#### 63. MR STEVE ARNFIELD DEPUTY CHIEF EXECUTIVE

The three Leaders referred to the imminent retirement of Mr Steve Arnfield the Deputy Chief Executive and thanked him for all his work for the Council, particularly with regards to the preparation of each year's budget and wished him a full and happy retirement.

# 64. BUDGET 2014/2015: COUNCIL TAX 2014/2015: AND OTHER ASSOCIATED FINANCIAL MATTERS

Councillor Morgan declared an interest with respect to the Capital Programme and took no part in the discussion thereon.

It was moved by Councillor Morris and seconded by Councillor Mrs Thomas:-

- (i) That the following recommendations of the Cabinet on 17<sup>th</sup> February 2014 be approved:-
  - (a) The Revenue Budget as set out in the Budget Report
  - (b) That Council Tax be increased by 1.94% in 2014/15. For the Council's element of Council Tax this represents an increase of less than 31p per week for a Band A property (approximately 50% of Council Tax payers don't pay the full increase either because they are in receipt of Council Tax Benefit or a discount)
  - (c) That £0.4m of the on-going saving from the reduced precept from TfGM be earmarked to fund an increase in the pay for those at the lowest end of the Council's pay scales. The balance of £0.6m in 2014/15 be added to the available one-off resources with the balance of the ongoing saving of £0.6m being held to offset the £25m reductions required in 2015/16
  - (d) That the one-off resources be allocated as follows:-
    - £1m additional investment in main highways schemes
    - £1m investment in residential roads
    - £1m capital investment in facilities for young people
    - Half a million pounds to create a hardship fund to support those who are in difficulty as a result of the impact of Benefit changes
    - Half a million pounds to create a fund to provide support for voluntary and community groups who

- are considering working with the Council to assist in the reduction in demand for Council services
- £3m be retained as a contribution towards the likely cashflow shortfall in 2015/16 (currently estimated at approximately £10m)
- (e) The Council be recommended to approve the Capital Programme for 2014/15 to 2016/17
- (f) The Council be recommended to approve the Investment and Prudential Indicators and Treasury Strategies 2014/15 to 2016/17
- (ii) It be noted that on 9<sup>th</sup> December 2013 the Cabinet calculated
  - (a) the Council Tax Base 2014/15 for the whole Council area as 69,162 (item T in the formula in Section 31B of the Local Government Finance Act 1992, as amended (the "Act"); and
  - (b) for dwellings in those parts of its area to which a Parish precept relates as:

- (iii) Calculate that the Council Tax requirement for the Council's own purposes for 2014/15 (excluding Parish precepts) is £88,690,000.
- (iv) That the following amounts be calculated for the year 2014/15 in accordance with Sections 31 to 36 of the Act.

(a) £223,175,335 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A(2) of the Act taking into account all precepts issued to it by Parish Councils.

(b) £134,121,000 being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A(3) of the Act.

(c) £89,054,335 being the amount by which the aggregate at (iv)(a) above exceeds the aggregate at (iv)(b) above, calculated by the Council in accordance with Section 31A(4) of the Act as its Council Tax requirement for the year. (Item R in the formula in Section 31B of the Act).

(d) £1,287.62 being the amount at (iv)(c) above (Item R), all divided by Item T ((ii)(a) above), calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 31B of the Act, as the basic amount of its Council Tax for the year (including Parish precepts).

(e) £364,335 being the aggregate amount of all special items (Parish precepts) referred to in Section 34(1) of the Act, each individual parish precept being:-

(f) £1,276.56 being the amount at (iv)(d) above less the result given by dividing the

- (ix) That it be noted that the Government have set a National Non-Domestic Rate of 47.1p in the pound for small businesses and 48.2p in the pound for larger businesses for the financial year 2014/15.

This is made up of the following proposals:-

(a) That the Council Tax increase for Bolton Council should be set at zero and this will be funded by the £1m Council Tax Freeze Grant offered by Central Government, plus £600,000 ongoing Revenue savings as follows:-

(b) That £0.4m of the ongoing savings from the reduced precept from TfGM be earmarked to fund an increase

in the pay for those at the lowest end of the council's pay scales

One off resources to be allocated as follows:

- (c) Reduce the Capital provision for Private Sector Renewal in the Capital Programme by £1m and allocate this £1m for additional capital investment into main Highways schemes
- (d) £1m investment into residential roads
- (e) £1m Capital investment in facilities for young people (schemes to be approved by council)
- (f) Half a million pounds to create a fund to provide support for voluntary and community groups who are considering working with the Council to assist in the reduction in demand for Council services with updates on spend and projects quarterly to Corporate Scrutiny
- (g) Allocate £1m as one-off additional investment to Environmental Services to provide 2 additional teams for a 2 year period to improve cleanliness and enforcement of cleanliness (including dog fouling) of the Borough as follows:-

(h) £3m be retained as a contribution towards the forecast cash flow shortfall in 2015/16

- (i) Delete the £0.5m allocation to a Hardship Fund as the Local Authority we should not be topping up nationally funded benefits. There needs to be a clear distinction between worklessness and those affected by disability/age etc.
- (j) Additional one-off funding of £220,000 for Area Fora allocated equally across all Wards
- (k) Allocate additional one-off funding of £280,000 to reinstate the existing universal summer play schemes for a further 2 years.

    - (ii) that a review of Special Responsibility
      Allowances paid to Councillors be carried out
      and implemented from 1<sup>st</sup> June 2014. The target
      of that review will be set at achieving £60,000
      savings in a full year and £50,000 in 2014/15,
      this saving being used to help fund the Council
      Tax freeze:
    - (iii) that the balance of the amount needed to fund the Council Tax freeze (£550,000 for 2014/15) be met from the amount retained as a contribution towards the likely cashflow shortfall in 2015/16 ie to £2.45m.
- (c) Agree as set out in the substantive Council Tax resolution
- (d) Agree as set out in the substantive Council Tax resolution, subject to the following:-

whilst welcoming the proposed one-off expenditure on highways, Council considers that the condition of the Borough's highways, particularly in residential areas, urgently needs far greater investment. It therefore determines that, subject to the undermentioned funds being available, a total one off investment of £5 million be made (ie. £3m additional); £1 million for

main roads schemes (mainly capital spending) and £4 million for residential roads (a mix of capital and revenue). This extra investment being funded by utilising £1 million of the anticipated underspend on the 2013/14 revenue budget, and £2 million of the anticipated capital receipt from the sale of the Smithills Estate.

- (e) Agree as set out in the substantive Council Tax resolution.
- (f) Agree as set out in the substantive Council Tax resolution.

#### Addition of the following:-

- (g) that, subject to the undermentioned funding being available, the budgets of Area Forums be enhanced by £25,000 per ward (a total of £500,000) funded by the remainder of the underspend on the 2013/14 revenue budget;
- (h) any money remaining from the proceeds of the sale of the Smithills Estate (other than the £500,000 already allocated for work to Smithills Hall) be allocated to capital schemes designed to enhance the town centres of the outlying districts of Horwich, Westhoughton, Blackrod, Farnworth, Kearsley and Little Lever.
- (ii) to (xiii) Agree as set out in the substantive Council Tax resolution.

Amend the substantive Council Tax resolution as follows:-

(xiv) Council further resolves to approach the Electoral Commission with a view to starting the necessary process to reduce the number of Councillors from three per ward to two per ward involving a likely cost saving of up to £300,000 a year.

(xv) Council also resolves to ask for an urgent report on the benefits and costs of installing solar panels on all suitable Council buildings.
