## 54. PROPOSED EXPANSION OF BLACKROD COMMUNITY PRIMARY SCHOOL

Councillor Cunliffe declared an interest in the following item of business as she is a Governor at the School

Further to Minute 44 of the meeting of the Executive Member held on 5th December, 2016, the Director of People submitted a report which outlined the response to the public consultation on proposals to expand provision of Blackrod CP School by increasing the Planned Admission Number from 30 to 45 pupils from 1st September, 2017 and sought approval to publish the associated relevant Statutory Notice advising of the proposed increase.

The report also sought permission for officers to progress the details of the design of the necessary remodelling and extension to the School through Kier Construction via the national SCAPE contractor procurement framework, on the basis detailed in the report.

The report advised that publication of the Statutory Notice would start the process of a four week consultation period of representation where interested parties can put forward representations. A further report detailing the outcome of this phase would be submitted to a future meeting of the Executive Member.

Following a recommendation by the Executive Cabinet Member for Education, Schools, Safeguarding and Looked after Children, the Executive Member NOTED –

- (i) The responses to the consultation exercise on proposal to increase the planned admission number at Blackrod CP School; and APPROVED -
- (ii) The publication of the relevant Statutory Notice to expand provision at Blackrod CP School by permanently raising the Planned Admission Number from 30 to 45 pupils as from 1st September, 2017; and AUTHORISED-
- (iii) Officers to work with Kier Construction through the national SCAPE contractor framework to develop a proposal to undertake the necessary remodelling and expansion of the School, on the basis detailed in the report now submitted.

# 56. YOUTH OFFENDING TEAM EFFICIENCY REPORT ON THE REDUCTION IN YOUT JUSTICE BOARD GRANT FUNDING
