disturbances in the public gallery and, following further disturbances, requested clearance of the public gallery in accordance with such Standing Orders.

Whereupon as an amendment, it was moved by Councillor J. Walsh and seconded by Councillor Greenhalgh -

This Council welcomes the Government's additional funding for Bolton Council for a zero council tax rise in each of the last two years since it was elected. This has resulted in around £8million more being left in the pockets and purses of council tax-payers of Bolton enabling them to decide how to spend the money rather than the Council deciding for them. Accordingly in welcoming this new freedom of choice for tax-payers and the additional spending opportunities given to them in local shops and businesses thus boosting the local economy, the Council now determines to plan for a zero council tax rise in 2013/2014 so that the cumulative benefit continues to grow year on year.

Upon being put to the vote, the amendment was declared lost.

Whereupon as a second amendment, it was moved by Councillor Hayes and seconded by Councillor D.A. Wilkinson -

That in setting the Budget for 2012/13 Council

a) Welcomes

- the funding provided by Government which will ensure that there will be a zero increase in Council Tax for the second successive year;
- (ii) moves by the Government to increase the income tax threshold towards £10,000 a year, which will benefit thousands of Bolton residents and lead to more disposable income being available to boost the local economy;

(iii) the most generous rise in the state pension for a generation, and linking the state pension to the rise in earnings, or the rise in prices, or 2.5%, whichever is the greater:

All of which will lead to more disposable income being available to boost the local economy during this worldwide economic crisis

- b) Also welcomes the fact that all the reductions so far have been achieved without the use of compulsory redundancies;
- c) Determines to lobby the Government, through all relevant channels, in an attempt to ensure that local government in general, and Bolton in particular, does not suffer a disproportionate share of the necessary reductions in public expenditure;
- d) Resolves to seriously consider returning to a slimmed down Committee structure which would be more democratically transparent and would be cheaper – the target saving being at least £75,000 a year;
- e) Resolves that when the next dividend from Manchester Airport is received, serious consideration is given to allocating some of it to Area Forums for spending at the discretion of Ward Members to help delay further deterioration of the local infrastructure.

Upon being put to the vote, the second amendment was declared lost.

Whereupon the original motion was put to the vote and declared carried.

57. MOTION UNDER STANDING ORDER NO. 4 – QUEEN'S DIAMOND JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

It was moved by The Mayor, seconded by Councillor Morris and unanimously agreed –

That this Council wishes to place on record its congratulations to Her Majesty the Queen on the occasion of her Diamond Jubilee. Her devotion and dedication to all her subjects over her 60 year reign is immeasurable. Long may she reign.

58. MOTION UNDER STANDING ORDER NO. 4 – NORTHERN RAIL HUB

It was moved by Councillor Chadwick and seconded by Councillor Critchley -

This Council calls upon the Government to fund the Northern Rail Hub as a top priority in helping to rebalance the economy outside of the South East.

If it is to achieve economic growth, the north of England needs a rail network that provides faster, more frequent journeys, better connections and capacity to accommodate passengers throughout the day.

The Northern Hub can deliver this, when built it will improve connections between the towns and cities, ports and airports of the north and improve services for all passengers. If we remove the congestion around Manchester, we will get the benefits of electrification - which the Government has already approved.

The Northern hub has a strong business case – for every £1 the government invests, £4 will be returned to the economy of the north. We want to see the Northern Hub, a project that is crucial to economic growth in the north of England (between 20000 and 30000 jobs will be created through this rail intervention) being delivered in its totality in Network Rail's next Control Period 5 (2014-2019).

Any fragmentation will diminish both the benefits of the Hub solution and may, in some cases, make services worse.

Upon being put to the vote, the motion was declared carried.
