10/03/14	<p><u>Two Year Old Provision Progress Report</u></p> <p>Following a recommendation from the Executive Member for Schools and Skills, the Executive Cabinet Member APPROVED –</p> <p>The approach for creating additional two year old places in high need areas, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- identifying suitable providers to offer part time two year old funded places from the following Council building, Oldhams Children's Centre, Leverhulme Children's Centre and Crompton Children's Centre, subject to feasibility study and required capital spend;- funding minor capital programmes within Primary Schools to provide new part-time two year old places alongside current nursery places for 3-4 year olds; and- the allocation of trajectory funding in shortage areas for a specific number of new places through a targeted grant scheme, as outlined in the report now submitted.
