The Leader will also doubtless be aware that the Government has replied to the petition by the UK's Ukrainian community to the effect that it will not do that because 'the evidence is not sufficiently unequivocal'.

"Does the Leader share my incredulity at that response in view of the evidence that food was deliberately confiscated by communist activists on Stalin's orders. evidence that the borders of the Ukraine were deliberately closed (again on Stalin's orders) to prevent escape, and evidence that between 6 million and 10 million people died as a result?

"Will the Leader bring the Council's resolution and the unsatisfactory nature of the Government's response to the Petition to the attention of the Borough's MPs and ask them to try to get the Government to review its response?

"Will the Leader also confirm that, whatever the outcome of this action, the suffering of the Ukrainian people in 1932/33 will continue to be remembered in Bolton along with other genocides?"

The Executive Member will, I am sure, agree with me that transparency and equity should be the hallmarks of Council policy.

Will he therefore agree to bring a report to the appropriate PDG setting out how decisions on enforcement and prosecutions are determined to enable members and the

public to understand the process and to avoid any suggestions of dual standards when, for example, in what may appear to be similar cases one defendant is issued with a caution whilst another is prosecuted in the Magistrates Court resulting in a fine of £1,000 with costs of £1,000 and 6 penalty points on his driving licence?
