6. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS SESSION

Councillor McKeon introduced this item on the agenda and invited residents to ask any questions or put forward any comments they had regarding issues and concerns in the Wards.

- Q1 Why are there no dangerous 'bend' signs on Green Lane?
- A This issue had also been raised at the Town Council.
 There is a flashing warning sign on Green Lane, although it does fail to operate sometimes due to battery issues.
 When funds become available this would be looked at being electrified.
- Q2 The junction at Winter Hey Lane/Lea Lane/Church St/Longworth Rd is an accident waiting to happen. Could the light sequence be changed to a four road instead of three?
- A We have been advised that the cost of this would be £100,000 some of the reason for this is believed to be knock on effects on other lights in the system to maintain traffic flow through Horwich as a whole. The system is maintained centrally for Greater Manchester.
- Q3 A number of questions and locations were highlighted in relation to speeding traffic including Church Street and Chorley New Road. Residents also suggested volunteers could do speed checks to free up police time.
- A Members had requested that the plans for speed reductions in the area be extended to encompass Church Street. Members would pursue the suggestion of volunteer speed checks as other authorities had done this. Many things had been tried to reduce speeding and police enforcement was also limited due to their own staffing

reductions.

- Q4 Could the forum name be changed to Horwich and Blackrod to prevent confusion?
- A Members agreed this was a good idea it would be taken back and looked at.
- Q5 A resident stated that it was really difficult to report fly tipping online and had been told it could only be done this way.
- A Unfortunately this was the preferred method for reporting which can be done by Email to <u>neighbourhoodservicesinbox@bolton.gov.uk.</u> Alternatively people can ring the contact centre on 01204 333333.
- Q6 Could something be done about the beeping sound at the pedestrian crossing at Lea Lane, which has not been working for the past two years?
- A This will be reported back to the highways department.
- Q7 In order to improve attendance at these Area Forum meetings, could other methods be used to advertise them, such as community groups, leisure centres, schools, social media and local papers? The invite letter could also be posted on the Council's Facebook page.
- A These suggestions would be taken back and considered, the Council had been required to cut back on advertising spend due to budget constraints, so other avenues were welcomed.
- Q8 A number of questions were raised about the temporary car park at the New leisure centre and health centre buildings. A question was also asked about how these buildings were being funded.
- A The car park was to be accessed from Drinkwater Lane and had permission for 12 months. Both buildings should be constructed within this time.

The leisure centre was funded by the Council through the Leisure Trust, the health centre was being paid for by the National Health Service.

- Q9 What was happening about the executive homes near Bob Smithy that had breached planning permissions?
- A This fell within the Heaton & Lostock ward but Councillor Silvester had lodged an objection and would continue to monitor the situation though the developer had six months to lodge an appeal so this could take some time before a resolution was finalised.

A resident stated that the speed humps installed on Claypool some time ago had worked well and thanked the council for installing them.

Resolved – That the questions be noted and those which were not answered be directed to the appropriate departments or partner agencies.

Councillor McKeon thanked everyone for attending and advised that the next forum was still to be confirmed, but residents would be informed through the usual channels.
