**14. ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES
PREVALENCE STUDY COMMISSIONING INTENTIONS**

The Director of Public Health submitted a report which outlined the commissioning intentions in relation to the procurement of a population study to estimate the prevalence and impact of adverse childhood experiences for the population of Bolton.

The report advised that as part Bolton's submission for GM monies, Public Health had proposed the commissioning of an Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) prevalence study that

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would be valuable in informing future trauma/ACE based delivery models.

The bid had been successful and the monies awarded, together with the contribution from the Council's Public Health Department would fund the costs of the Study.
