Each year, Ofsted carries out an assessment of the strengths and challenges of Bolton's Services to Children and Young People. The assessments are carried out into each of the 5 outcome areas of Every Child Matters.

The Assessments are graded 1, 2, 3 or 4 (4 being the highest grade).

The assessment also makes a judgement on the overall effectiveness of Children's Services.
