Theoretically more signs could be provided although funding would need to be identified for this work. In addition there is the visual aspect to be considered as to whether it would be desirable to have additional signs and road markings within the park.</li> <li>Q2. Enforcement of speed limits can only be carried out by the police and this would therefore need to be directed to them.</li> <li>Q3. Road humps are generally used as a casualty reduction measure; however they can be effective in helping to reduce vehicle speeds. They can be quite costly to install and any scheme would need to comply with the applicable regulations. Unfortunately Highways currently has no budget to progress such schemes and therefore external funding would be required to enable us to consider a scheme further.</li> </ul>
