1. SOCIAL NEEDS TRANSPORT SAVINGS AND EFFICIENCIES REVIEW

The Director of People submitted a report which set out the results of the consultation on proposals to merge the transportation routes for Social Needs Transport of vulnerable adults, to achieve improved service efficiency and to deliver savings and sought the Executive Cabinet Member's approval to implement the final proposals.

The Executive Cabinet Member was advised that the consultation exercise ended on 12th February, 2016 and the formal trade union responses had been received and the UNISON response was detailed in Appendix 1 to the report.

As a result of the consultation, the final proposal remained unchanged and it was proposed that full implementation would coincide with the new school year and the completion of the

Brazley development in September, 2016 rather than July, 2016 as stated in the original proposals.

The relevant Equality Impact Assessment had been undertaken and was attached at Appendix 3 to the report.

The Executive Cabinet Members APPROVED the final proposals in relation to the Social Needs Transport Savings and Efficiencies Review and to progress the implementation of Phase 2 of the review as detailed in the report.
