### Licensing Act 2003 - Hearing of an Application to Review a Premises Licence

### 1. Background

- 1. The Licensing Act 2003, which consolidated six licensing regimes in a single statute, and which replaced the previous controls on the sale of alcohol under the provisions of the Licensing Act 1964, introduced the concept of the 'premises licence'.
- 2. A premises licence is required for any venue where any 'licensable activity' is carried on. Such activities include the sale or supply of alcohol, the provision of regulated entertainment and the provision of late-night refreshment etc.
- 3. All pubs, nightclubs, private members clubs, off licences, cinemas, theatres and late-night takeaways etc require a licence.
- 4. The government included a very clear presumption in favour of businesses in the Licensing Act 2003 since the Act requires that any application should be granted on the terms on which it is applied for unless any valid representation is made.
- 5. Where representations are made, the Act suggests that the Licensing Authority can apply 'light touch' regulation.
- 6. This approach is 'balanced' in the Act by provisions which permit a premises licence to be 'reviewed' by the Licensing Authority, upon receipt of a valid application for review from an interested party, responsible authority or any other person.
- 7. An application for the review of a premises licence must be circulated to the 'responsible authorities' to give them the opportunity to make representations. (Police, Fire Service, Environmental Health Pollution Control & Health & Safety, Trading Standards, Social Services Child Protection Unit, Planning Department, Public Health and the Home Office Immigration).
- 8. Where an application for a review has been accepted by the Licensing Authority the Act requires that a notice is displayed on the premises, in a position where it can be seen from the outside of the premises, stating that an application to review the premises licence has been made. A notice is also displayed at the Licensing Unit offices.
- Members of the public or businesses in the area where the premises to which the review application relates is situated, or their representatives, can also make representations, which can be considered as part of the review.
- 10. Representations are only valid where they relate to one of the four licensing objectives, namely:
  - a) the prevention of public nuisance
  - b) the prevention of crime and disorder
  - c) ensuring public safety
  - d) protection of children from harm

The review application must be considered in the light of the four licensing objectives (above) and the Bolton MBC Statement of Licensing Policy.

### 2. Application for review of the Premises Licence

- 1. The licensing team is in receipt of an application to review a premises licence. The applicant is the Licensing Authority (Enforcement Team).
- 2. The Licensing Authority (Enforcement Team) are a Responsible Authority under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 3. The application is to review the licence held by New River Trustee 7 Ltd & New River Trustee 8 Ltd for the premises that trade as the Waggon and Horses, 170 Chorley Road, Westhoughton in Bolton.
- 4. Mr Steven Wilkinson is the designated premises supervisor (DPS), and he holds a personal licence granted by Bolton Council.
- 5. The application relates to the 'prevention of crime and disorder' and 'public safety' which are two of the four licensing objectives.
- 6. All applications for the review of a premises licence require the applicant to state the 'grounds for the review'. The Licensing Authority (Enforcement Team). have provided the following information:

I am a Licensing Enforcement Officer employed by Bolton Council. The Licensing Authority is a responsible authority under the Licensing Act 2003. I wish to apply for a review of the premises licence granted for premises at Waggon & Horses 170 Chorley Road, Westhoughton, Bolton BL5 3PW

The operation of this premises has seriously undermined two of the four licensing objectives, namely;

- Public safety.
- · Prevention of crime and disorder

Due to the high levels of Coronavirus evident across the UK, On 5th November 2020, the Government ordered that certain businesses and venues must close or restrict how they provide goods and services. This included:

Hospitality venues such as cafes, restaurants, pubs, bars, and social clubs; with the exception of providing food and drink for takeaway (before 10pm; and not including alcohol), click-and-collect, drive-through or delivery.

On the 20<sup>th</sup> November 2020 Licensing Enforcement Officers from Bolton Council visited the premises in response to complaints that had been received into the Council from concerned members of the public. The complaints were that people were being permitted to drink in the premises in breach of the Government 'Stay at home' restrictions. Officers spoke to the person managing the premises on that day, a Mr Michael McNamara and advised of the restrictions that had been imposed.

On Monday 23rd November 2020 officers from Greater Manchester Police attended at the premises in response of reports to them that people were inside drinking. On their arrival officers initially looked through the windows of the premises and observed 3 males inside. The front entrance to the premises was locked. One of the males was later confirmed as being Mr Michael McNamara. The other two males were seen to be seated at a table with alcoholic drinks in front of them. The officers observed one of the males sneaking off towards the rear of the premises. The officers gained entry to the premises where they were greeted by Mr McNamara. He claimed that there had only been one other person in the premises and that he had left. It was claimed by Mr McNamara that this male had been pointing for him. The officers searched the premises and found one

of the males hiding in a toilet. When questioned by the officers Mr McNamara admitted serving the two males' alcohol that was consumed on the premises but had not charged them for the drinks. The officers were wearing body worn cctv at the time and captured the incident. This will be produced as exhibit ref SDM1. Three photographs of the footage have been extracted from the footage and are produced as Exhibit ref SDM2

On the 25th November 2020 a fixed penalty notice was issued Mr Michael McNamara at Waggon & Horses, 170 Chorley Road, Westhoughton, Bolton BL5 3PW. This is produced as Exhibit ref SDM3

The grounds for imposing the penalty were under as follows:

The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England) (No4) Regulations 2020.

In relation to a breach of Regulation 15(1) (Business or service listed in Part 1 of the Schedule, or is carried on from, or provided at, premises of a kind specified in Part 1 of the Schedule):

Failed, without reasonable excuse, to close the premises, or part(s) of the premises, in which food or drink are provided for consumption on the premises; and/or Failed, without reasonable excuse, to cease providing food or drink for consumption on the premises.

Particulars of the offence outlined in the penalty were as follow: Following a visit by Greater Manchester Police wearing body worn camera to Waggon and Horses, 170 Chorley Road, Westhoughton, Bolton, BL5 3PN on 23rd November 2020 at around 17:05 Elizabeth Pritchard, Authorised Officer, witnessed that the premises were open and carrying on the business of a public house by providing drink for consumption on the premises.

Records show that Mr McNamara appealed the penalty, but the appeal was dismissed. The penalty notice remains unpaid and is now subject of judicial proceedings at a date yet to be confirmed. A copy of the appeal letter is produced as Exhibit ref SDM4, and the dismissal letter as Exhibit ref SDM5

I submit that the manner in which the premises have been managed, allowing people to drink on the premises in breach of the Government restrictions falls short of what is expected from a licensee in promoting the licensing objectives.

These actions put the welfare of staff, customers, attending Police, Council Officers, and the wider members of the public in danger of contracting a potentially fatal illness. I consider the behaviour and actions of the management at Waggon & Horses, 170 Chorley Road, Westhoughton, Bolton BL5 3PW to have been totally irresponsible especially during the period of 'Stay at Home' restrictions that the UK had been placed under.

The instructions and regulations given to Licenced Premises are clear and should be understood by everybody. There is a clear risk to Public Health during a global pandemic.

The reasons for this review are:

On 23rd November 2020, these premises showed a blatant disregard for the legislation and global pandemic at a time when the UK had been placed into 'Stay at Home' restrictions.

The instructions and guidance given to licensed premises were clear -

Hospitality venues such as cafes, restaurants, pubs, bars, and social clubs; with the exception of providing food and drink for takeaway (before 10pm; and not including alcohol), click-and-collect, drive-through or delivery.

These actions put the welfare of staff, customers, attending Police, Council Officers, and the wider members of the public in danger of contracting a potentially fatal illness.

The Government has published a four-step roadmap to ease restrictions across England which outline different measures that hospitality venues will have to adhere to at each step. Given the premises ignored the legislation previously I question whether they will follow the new requirements even with clear instructions and guidance provided, therefore potentially putting recovery at risk.

- 8. The licensing team has accepted the application for the review of the premises licence as valid.
- 9. On the 18<sup>th</sup> May 2021, the licensing team shared the application with the Responsible Authorities. No further comments have been received.
- Following acceptance of the application, copies of the application and supporting documentation were hand delivered to the Waggon and Horses.
- 11. The notices required under the legislation were displayed at the Waggon and Horses and at the offices of the Licensing Authority.
- 12. The notices were correctly displayed on the premises when checked by an officer from the licensing team on the 18<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> May and 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2021.





The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England)
(No.4) Regulations 2020

Thank you for your recent correspondence regarding the above matter. I am now in a position to provide you with a response into my investigation.

The facts surrounding the alleged offence in relation to The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England) (No.4) Regulations 2020, as amended (SI. 2020: No. 1200) have been reported to me by the investigating officer of the Licensing Unit.

In view of the evidence you have stated within your communication, I am writing to inform you that after consideration, I am dismissing your appeal on the grounds that there is sufficient evidence that would enable Bolton Council to proceed against you for contravention of the above legislation.

The information you have submitted is not valid evidence that would mitigate the circumstances described in the investigating officers testimonies and I am satisfied that at the time of the visit the business was providing alcohol during the emergency period other than as permitted by the legislation.

The activity witnessed is a violation of Regulation 15(1) of the aforementioned legislation -

As a business or service listed in Part 1 of the Schedule, or is carried on from, or provided at, premises of a kind specified in Part 1 of the Schedule you:

 Failed, without reasonable excuse, to cease providing food or drink for consumption on the premises

May I take this opportunity to remind you that if you do not discharge your liability to prosecution for the offence, Bolton Council will have no option but to initiate prosecution procedures for the offence in the Magistrates Court, where the maximum fine available is <u>unlimited</u>. The Court may also award costs against the defendant, and if convicted, you may obtain a criminal record for the offence.

Please be aware that no further reminders will be issued in respect of this notice.

## <u>Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions under the Licensing Act 2003</u> <u>Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol</u>

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### The following conditions shall come into force on 6th April 2010

- 1.(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act):
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
  - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
  - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

## The following conditions shall come into force on 1st October 2010

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
  - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

The following conditions shall come into force on 28th May 2014 Ban on sales of alcohol below the permitted price

The relevant person (the holder of the premises licence, the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence, or any member or officer of a club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question) shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

The permitted price is defined as the aggregate of the duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol on the date of its sale or supply and the amount of that duty multiplied by a percentage which represents the rate of VAT chargeable in relation to the alcohol on the date of its sale or supply. Detailed guidance on how to make this calculation and a calculator to determine permitted prices for each product are available on the Home Office website.

Where there is a change to the rate of duty or VAT applying to alcohol (for instance, following a Budget), the relevant person should ensure that the permitted price reflects the new rates within fourteen days of the introduction of the new rate.

It is still permitted to sell alcohol using promotions (as long as they are compatible with any other licensing condition that may be in force), and the relevant person should ensure that the price of the alcohol is not less than the permitted price. Detailed guidance on the use of promotions is given in the guidance document available on the Home Office website

### Mandatory conditions: door supervision

- 1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 2.But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed-
- a) In respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films),
- b) In respect of premises in relation to-
  - 1. any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
  - 2. any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- 3. For the purposes of this section-
- a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2 (1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
- b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

### Mandatory condition: exhibition of films

1. Where any film is to be exhibited by virtue of the permissions granted by this licence and where the film has been classified by the British Board of Film Censors (BBFC), the admission of children to the

exhibition of the film shall be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the BBFC.

- 2. Where the venue intends to exhibit a film which has not been classified by the BBFC the premises licence holder shall submit the film which it is intended to exhibit to the licensing authority, 28 days before the date on which it is proposed that the exhibition of the film will take place and the admission of children to the exhibition of the film must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the licensing authority.
- 3. Where the licensing authority has notified the holder of the premises licence that section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to any film, the admission of children to the exhibition of the film must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the licensing authority.

## Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule The prevention of crime and disorder

- 1. Any person exercising a security activity (as defined by paragraph 2(1)(a) of schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001) shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 2. Such a person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of the Premises Licence.
- 3. Any person defined in condition (1) will clearly display his name badge at all times whilst on duty.
- 4. No customers apparently carrying opened bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public.
- 5. Where CCTV is installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and made available within a reasonable time upon request by the police.
- 6. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.

### Public safety

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

- 1. To comply with the reasonable requests of the fire officer from time to time.
- 2. To comply with the reasonable requests of the building control officer.

### The Prevention of Public Nuisance
