#### 46. MOTION UNDER STANDING ORDER NO. 4 – ENHANCEMENT OF RAIL SERVICES

It was moved by Councillor Haslam and seconded by Councillor Wild -

This Council is mindful of the fact that fast reliable rail connections to the main centres of population are an essential prerequisite for regeneration and the development of Bolton's economy. It is clear that there is a strong business case to be made for more rail services from Bolton to serve the major economic centres of Britain.

In the absence of anything being prepared at Greater Manchester level which actively supports Bolton's case then this Council requests the appropriate officer to commission a report which sets out both the business case and economic reasons for the enhancement of rail services to and from Bolton.

This report will need to consider the benefits not only for the Bolton economy but also for the rail companies. This can be done by:-

- The restoration of the Scottish services from Manchester Airport to Glasgow and Edinburgh via Bolton following the electrification of the Bolton to Preston and Manchester lines in December 2016;
- The rerouting of half of the Birmingham to Scotland services via Bolton which will serve the greater population centres of Stockport, Manchester and Bolton than those at present served;
- Consideration of the Cross Country services to the south and south west starting from Bolton or Preston thus restoring the service pattern which has previously existed; and
- 4) The installation of direct daily train services from Bolton to London.

This report will need to be presented to Network Rail, Department of Transport, Transport for Greater Manchester and the train operating companies of Trans Pennine Express, Cross Country, Virgin and Northern Rail.

Upon being put to the vote, the Motion was declared carried.
