Context

- 19 Secondary Schools
- 102 Primary Schools
- 18,000 pupils attending Secondary schools
- 27,982 pupils attending Primary schools

Outline of trends

- Decrease in the number of exclusions citing persistent disruptive behaviour
- Increase in 'one off' incidents
- Increase in the number of KS1 pupils receiving an exclusion.
- Decrease in the number of pupils with Educational Health and Care Plans receiving exclusions.

Strategic planning

- School based SEMH provisions to proactively address concerns earlier.
- Collaborative working group of senior pastoral leaders has been established to consolidate and share good practice.
- Policy development via Primary and Secondary Headteachers' forums to adapt to changing needs of young people and families.
- Development of the Behaviour Support Service to offer more bespoke training to school staff and support to families.
