1.0 Introduction

As part of its annual programme of work the Children's Services Scrutiny Committee requested information on the indicators within the Positive Contribution outcome area of the Every Child Matters Outcomes (ECM) Framework along with an overview of Bolton's performance against the indicators. This report seeks to provide details of the indicators and where available Bolton's performance and comparison with both statistical neighbours and the average for England.

2.0 Format of the Report

The report contains:

- An overview sheet providing an 'at-a-glance' indication of performance against targets and direction of travel against each of the ECM Outcomes as at year end 2008/09.
- A detailed breakdown of performance for those indicators contained within the Make a Positive Contribution Outcome area of the ECM framework. The breakdown of performance considers individual targets against set against the indicators and shows whether year end targets were met, whether performance is improving or declining compared to last year and the improvement actions being taken. These are broken down by plan into:
 - Bolton's Local Area Agreement (LAA) targets
 - Bolton's Community Strategy targets
 - All other National Indicators in the ECM Outcomes Framework
- To give an indication of how Bolton's performance is comparing with others, the report also shows, in very simple terms, whether Bolton performance was better or worse than the national average and the average of our statistical neighbours whenever this information was last published.

3.0 Headline Commentary on Performance for Positive Contributions Outcome Area

12 of the indicators within this outcome area did not have a target set for 2008-09 largely because many are perception indicators collected by national surveys for the first time in 2008. The results will form a baseline to enable improvement targets to be set for when the survey is repeated in 2010.

Performance on indicators which look at children and young people who have committed offences is generally improving. The proportion of young offenders who are EET has increased, as has the proportion of young offenders who are suitably accommodated – though it should be noted here that since our last submission of figures for this indicator the YJB has issued new guidance which allows us to count custody as suitable accommodation.

 Young Offenders engaged in suitable education, employment or training increased from 71% to 81.1% Rate of young people receiving a custodial sentence has increased from 5.8 % to 6.9%
though this was in the context of a falling number of young people becoming involved in the criminal justice system.

Actions to Improve Performance include:

- Implementation of the Community Reparation element of the Youth Crime Action Plan
- Provision of Targeted Youth Support
- Build upon the strong introduction of Diploma Courses in Bolton in Autumn 2008
- Drive improvements in 14-19 performance via the Attainment, Participation and Progression sub-group of the 14-19 Partnership

















Direction of Travel
