Section 15A allows a landowner to deposit a landowner statement accompanied by a map which brings to an end any period of recreational use 'as of right' over the land to which the statement and map relate. The notices erected are deposits under this act and all the areas shaded and edged red relate to the deposit. This does not affect the public's right to use any recorded Public Rights of Way that lead over these areas of land, all of which have been shown on the deposit map. Any other routes not shown are not recorded as Public Rights of Way.
