RAA's - The background


 May 2015 - government announced changes to the delivery of adoption services by proposing that all adoption services should be delivered on a regional basis by 2020.

The aims are for the new agencies are to:

- Increase the number of children adopted
- Reduce the length of time children wait to be adopted
- Improve post adoption support services to families who have adopted
- Reduce the number of adoption agencies to improve efficiency and effectiveness

- Since then, Bolton, Bury, BwD, Rochdale, Tameside and Oldham local authorities have been working together with Adoption Matters and Caritas Care (Voluntary Adoption Agencies) to develop plans for a Regional Adoption Agency.
- Transition Plans have been periodically submitted to the Department for Education to detail how our local authorities will move from current arrangements to a single Regional Agency covering the existing local authority areas.

Regional breakdown Adoptions 2014-16



Last year in England 4,690 children were adopted from care into new families (year end 31.3.16)2015 saw highest number since data collection began in 2009- 5,360

Bolton Outcomes 2014-2016


2013/14

- 61 matched for Adoption (5x2)
- 59 children adopted
- 27 Adoptive families approved
- 1 placement disrupted (1 child age 7)

2015/16


- 38 matched for Adoption
- 44 children adopted
- 30 families approved
- 1 disruption. 2 adopters withdrew.
- 1 relinquished child






Nationally – Best performing agencies 3 year average for % of children who leave care to adoption (to 2016)
